




What have we been learning?

What have we been learning?

In amongst the chocolate and chicks, and aside from all of the usual intensive SATs practice, we also found time for some serious science. Cole, the Year 9 boy in our Year 6 class, was adamant that he could smell tapwater. Needing to complete some Science fair test work - I seized upon this as an opportunity to engage in a rigorous scientific experiment. Well, as rigorous as we can manage anyway! What have we been learning? DRB Key Stage 2



Junior DRB, Year 5 and Year 6 had the privilege of meeting Liverpool's 'Love artGlobal' artist, Jay Wheeler.

Jay Wheeler is a war veteran. From a young age Jay was keen to join the army, his motivation came from watching a news report showing aid being given out by soldiers in Bosnia. He was determined to give aid and restore peace in war torn countries, but was unprepared for the reality of army life. Jay served in the army for an outstanding 15 years and receiving 2 Kosovo, 2 Iraq and 1 Afghanistan medals. On his return home to Liverpool he struggled with his mental health and was diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). After a journey of self-discovery and support from friends, family, medical professionals and God, Jay found art. Jay explained how art saved him and changed his life forever.

Jay now graffiti tags 'LOVE' around the streets of Liverpool (and further afield) as a social intervention to support us in seeing life in a positive light and as a reminder of how precious life is.

Jay shared his moving story with us in assembly where the children sat and listened with respect. Following assembly, we headed outside where Jay showed the children how to graffiti tag 'LOVE'. The children watched in awe and could hardly contain their excitement when they had a turn using the spray paint.

We are looking forward to welcoming Jay back to school in the Summer Term when, together with Junior DRB, Year 5 and Year 6, we will be tagging the wall on Year 3/4 yard with 'LOVE'.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Due to a high number of complaints across the city we are having to issue another reminder to motorists about your responsibility as a driver to park responsibly. We need to share the road with all road users, especially the more vulnerable, and allow for safe access for pedestrians and cyclists.

Remember pupils need to see and be seen when crossing the roads so please think seriously about the location of the school and neighbourhood and consider ways you can help as a parent/guardian to improve their road safety.

If you use a vehicle to drop off and pick up your child from School, please consider parking further away from the entrance & exits in a safe legal place and walk the remainder of the journey.

Do Not Park on

- School Keep Clear Zig Zags
- Double/Single Yellow Lines
- · Close to junctions / Drop Kerbs
- Near School Crossing Patrol locations
- On Pavements
- Cycle Lanes
- · In front of resident driveways

Parking Services and Police may be in attendance near your school do not be abusive as they are doing their jobs at the requests of concerns raised regarding road safety of the pupils.

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

High temperature

If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until <u>ALL</u> the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Sore throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a <u>sore throat</u>. But if they also have a high temperature, they should stay at home until it goes away.

A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of <u>tonsillitis</u>.

Scarlet fever

If your child has <u>scarlet fever</u>, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Otherwise they'll be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks.

Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.
