Just a reminder to all about ensuring your child is wearing the correct uniform for school. Your child's footwear should be black, not brightly or multicoloured. Year 1



This week, the children enjoyed looking at the stages in life they've been through so far. They sorted pictures of themselves discussing whether they were a baby, toddler or child. In Maths, we've finished our unit of place value within 10, looking at counting forwards and backwards including 1 more and 1 less, as well as comparing numbers. In Science, we discussed what a healthy meal is. The children enjoyed creating their own healthy meal with a variety of different types of food. We've had a great week in Year 1!

Year 2

We're slowly but surely getting towards the end of term and you can tell in Year 2, not because we're slowing down at all, but because everyone is totally in their stride and the amount of progress we are making is building steadily. In Maths, the children are much more fluent with larger numbers, partitioning them in different ways and also building addition and subtraction fact families. In PE, the children finally managed to get everyone across the river with no one eaten by piranhas by using their one legged balance skills, good strategy and teamwork. In Maths we have started our new topic of addition and subtraction, polishing up on our column addition and subtraction from last year. In Art, we have been exploring colour theory, focusing on how we can use our primary colours to create different shades and tints of browns. After some experimenting, we then used the colours mixed to paint our charcoal studies of the Benin Bronzes. The class had a great time and the work produced was excellent! Well done for all your hard work this week Year 5!

Year 6

Year 6 have had a busy week! In English, I have shown great focus and pride in creating diary entries from the point of view of a slave, they should be very proud of their first fine write in year 6. In art, we have been looking at colouring mixing and creating different shades of brown, which we then used to paint a range of Benin Bronzes. We loved experimenting with warmer and cool shades, tones and tints. In maths, we have been looking at multiplication this week using the grid method and column method to multiply increasingly big numbers. We've also have a very sporty week, with girls playing rugby on Monday, football on Friday and lots taking part in cross country, well done to everyone for proudly representing our school!
